Parishioners Train with “Heart”

With folding banquet tables and fluorescent lights, the room looked like it could host any social event. On two nights in February, however, parishioners gathered in the Med Tech Ambulance Service classroom in Pawtucket for a serious purpose: to learn to save lives. Over three dozen persons including Fr. Dan and Fr. Morse received training in American Heart Association CPR and the use of AED (automated external defibrillators). Joe Laurent, an EMT and the principal instructor, offered detailed information on responding to emergencies involving children and adults and took questions over the course of three hours. As the parishioners took turns kneeling in front of mannequins, throwing their weight into rapid chest compressions and practicing with actual AEDs—placing pads, listening for prompts and staying clear—it helped to know that a few “angels” were looking over them, including Gary Reis, who donated the space, and the families who donated the AEDs for the church and parish center. As a parish that welcomes its members and the wider community to our Masses and events, we are grateful to be more prepared for any emergency.
